## Materials:

1 Sheet of blank white paper, 1 sheet of colored paper of your choice, ruler, scissors, pencil, a black marker, and your summer reading book. You will also need colored pencils, crayons, or markers.

## Directions:

- 1. Read one of the books listed on the summer reading list for fifth grade and:
  - Pick a moment in the book that is your favorite.
  - You should come up with a symbol you think would best fit this book (example: for <u>The Best Christmas Pageant Ever</u>, the Bible would be a good symbol).
  - Choose one character and a personality trait that describes them.
  - For setting, tell me the time and place of the story.
  - Tell me about the theme (lesson the author wants you to learn) of the book (example: for <u>The Best Christmas Pageant Ever</u>, a theme could be that people can change OR don't judge a book by its cover.)

- 2. Cut your white paper to be an 8 in. by 8 in. square and fold it to have 9 boxes (fold into thirds both ways.) Outline your boxes with a black marker.
- 3. Follow the guide below to fill in your boxes. Please title your boxes as it is below. Anything in (parentheses) you will replace with what it tells you to draw or write.
- 4. When you are all finished with your boxes, you will be gluing this in the center of a square colored piece of paper to make it look like a quilt square. Cut your colored paper to be 9in. by 9in. before gluing your finished square on top.
